On Saturday, May 12th 88 members from nine 4-H clubs in Ventura County participated Super Field Day. This year the event was expanded to include photography, sheep, pygmy goat, dairy goat, and new events – Cupcake Wars and an Iron Chef competition.



Throughout the day participants could shear a lamb; milk a goat; participate in showmanship workshops for lamb, pygmy and dairy goats; make a craft; and pick up a used uniform. Members competed in rabbit hopping, dog rally, educational posters, small animal showmanship, knowledge tests and cupcake decorating.

What was noticeable this year was the number of teen members working the event. Many of our senior members planned, prepared, worked and judged this event, demonstrating one of the things that sets 4-H apart – older members teaching the younger members.

A new opportunity this year was the Speaker's Corner. This was an area where any member could go and speak in front of a small group on any topic. Many members need to make a 4-H presentation for their project or for their Record Book and 20 kids took this opportunity to make a presentation.

The silent auction was also a big success. Items from a handmade horseshoe wreath to poultry feed and lamb halters were up for bid. Thank you to everyone who donated and bought something at the auction. This really makes the event financially successful.

For many, the highlight of the day was the Iron Chef competition. Eight teams from four clubs chopped, diced, seasoned and fried their way to the judges tasting table. This was a fun event for spectators too. And the presentation of the dishes were impressive.

The day ended with the awards ceremony where ribbons and medals were handed out for all the hard work. Super Field Day was super. We hope that everyone plans to attend again next year!

Master Gardeners Lead 4-H Vegetable Gardeners

Since September, 30 members from four clubs have been participating in the Countywide 4-H Master Gardener Vegetable Gardening project. The members learned about building raised beds, propagating seeds, determining soil quality, composting and much more. The meetings took place at the Hansen Agricultural Center in Santa Paula, where members were able to see vegetable gardening in the teaching gardens.

When asked what was the most valuable thing learned in the project, Lauren Fairall of Bardsdale 4-H replied, “You don’t need lots of space to grow a garden, and it’s not as hard as you may think to grow something. There is great value in growing your own produce.” She added, “And the kids are excited to eat the vegetables!”



Several of the clubs have been “showing off” their raised gardening beds. These beds were provided by a grant that supported this project’s materials and the effort to continue the gardening teaching within these clubs’ communities.




Photography at the Farm

COUNCIL CORNER

Highlights from the Ventura County 4-H Council



The Ventura County 4-H Council met on Wednesday, May 23rd.

Board Reports included the review and approval of the previous meetings minutes and Treasurer's Report. The Correspondence Secretary, Debbie Meyer-Morris announced that Orange County is offering a 4-H **Summer Camp** August 13-18 for members 9-13. The six-day camp is \$375. www.oc4h.org for details.

Ventura County **All-Stars**, Dayle Morris and Savanna Stanley reported that they had a very successful Grand Opening of the Roma-Jean Walking Path at Ormond Pointe. Tours will be offered on specific weekends for the remainder of the year. See the calendar for more details.

Debbie Meyer-Morris reported on the **So. Section Leaders Retreat** which offered excellent workshops and a tour of the Marquez Dairy facility. Additionally, she reported that **Food Faire & Fashion Revue** had been a great success with double the participants from last year. Terri Hargleroad reported on the success of **Super Field Day** with 88 participants in a number of events. See the article on cover for more details. This committee is already planning for next year's Field Day.

The **Fair** report was given by Chris Garmon. He reported that the asphalt has been poured for the new livestock facility and the contractor is set to be complete by June 1. Tagging Day activities on June 2 will be moved to grassy area near Fishes & Friends (where bungee jump is during fair). He reminded 4-H that only large livestock participating members will get wristbands. Everyone else should consider other pass options as detailed in emails to project members.

Jackie Larson reported that the **Equine PDC** has had two success events since March. They are preparing for Equine Field Day June 10th and Horse Fair July 19-21.

Bonnie Frost, Council Vice President, presented a clarification of the projects included in the **Fair Animal Deadline**. They will be Cattle (All), Goats (All), Poultry (Chicken & Turkeys), Rabbits (Market), Sheep (All), Swine (All). The enrollment deadline remains 12/31. The policy is available on the Council webpage.

Volunteers are needed for a Council Committee to find **4-H-friendly venues** for events and meetings. Interested leaders and senior members should contact the Council or 4-H Office.

The **Animal Project Commitment Letter** was presented as a Council-Approved agreement between members, parents and leaders regarding the responsibilities of raising a 4-H animal and the animal projects. The document is available on the Council's webpage.

Anita Wilvert presented the slate of officers for the **County Council 2012-2014** term. The officers include Jenean Bass, President; Bonnie Frost, Vice President; Debbie Meyer-Morris, Secretary; Rochelle Smith, Treasurer; Darlene Johnston, Ways & Means. The Corresponding Secretary position is currently open. The election will take place at the June meeting.

Also presented was the **2012-13 Council Budget Proposal**. The State announced in May an \$8 increase to the cost of members insurance. The Council was able to absorb some of this increase and has only increased membership enrollment by \$5 to \$35. Leaders costs remain the same, \$10. The complete budget proposal is online on the Council webpage. Input on the budget is appreciated by email before June 20th.



2012-13 4-H Year Enrollments / Re-enrollments

4-H re-enrollments take place in July when the new program year begins; the online process for the new program year cannot begin prior to July. Your Club Leader or Enrollment Specialist will send out an e-mail to their members and volunteers when the system is available to re-enroll for 2012-13. Re-enrolling in 4-H means to complete the paperwork, the online process and pay the fees.

The 4hOnline computer requirements are;

You must have one of the following web browsers:

Microsoft Internet Explorer 7.0 or newer (for Windows users)

Mozilla Firefox 1.5 or newer (for Windows and Apple users)

Netscape 8.0 or newer (for Windows or Apple users)

Mozilla Camino 1.5 or newer (for Apple users)

Apple's Safari is NOT supported.



You must enable cookies and Javascript.

If your computer does not meet the 4hOnline enrollment system requirements, maybe you can use a family member's computer or a friends' computer.

Now is the time to prepare for the new 4-H year by logging into the 4hOnline enrollment system to be sure you are able to get in and to resolve all access issues prior to June 30, 2012. Your Club Leader and club Enrollment Specialist can assist you with access problems.

The County 4-H office will notify all Club Leaders and Club Enrollment Specialists when the 4hOnline enrollment system is available for the 2012-13 program year enrollments. They will in turn notify their club members and volunteers. Watch your e-mails closely for this important e-mail from your Club Leader / Enrollment Specialist. They will also provide you with the deadline for submitting your paperwork to them AND completing the online enrollment process. You can find the Step-By-Step Guide to Re-enroll on our County 4-H website at http://ceventura.ucdavis.edu/Youth_Development/4-H/Enroll/Leaders/ scroll down towards the bottom of the page. Be sure to pay extra careful attention to your personal project list and make sure you make all additions and deletions needed so that it lists all the projects you want to participate in for the year.

All returning members and volunteers please be sure to follow the Step-By-Step Guide to **Re-enroll** to prevent duplicate records. The duplicate records have to be deleted and then the member or volunteer will have to re-do their enrollment correctly.

If you have not received a paper enrollment packet from your Club Leader or Enrollment Specialist, you can download them from our County 4-H website at http://ceventura.ucdavis.edu/Youth_Development/4-H/Enroll/Forms/ listed under "Ventura County Forms".

If you are planning to be out of town during the re-enrollment period, make sure you will have access to the internet to check your e-mails for the important system available e-mail and to complete the online enrollment by the deadline set by your club. Not completing the entire enrollment process by the deadline means you won't be on the list for Fair that is required from our office each year.

Be sure to double or triple check your enrollment packet for completion prior to submitting them to your Club Leader or Enrollment Specialist to minimize any delays. Be sure to submit each required form.



We hope that you had a great year in the Ventura County 4-H Program, and we hope that the New Year will be even better! Have a safe and wonderful summer! Don't forget your sunscreen and keep hydrated with plenty of water!
