
Loma Vista 4-H

Attendees asked many questions about the animals, such as "Is that goat pregnant" (of a pygmy goat) and "Why is that chicken so tall" (of a modern chicken). They also asked "What is 4-H?" The 4-Hers answered all of these questions politely and without hesitation.



Overall, the Hope Picnic was a great success and we were glad to be able to help out this cause.
