On April 19, 2015 our county equine projects got together for a Showmanship and Horsemanship clinic at Conejo Creek Equestrian Park located in Thousand Oaks. Terry Simon of Simi Valley taught the clinic, Terry hosts the monthly ETI Corral 118 shows in Simi Valley. Her passion in riding is showmanship and horsemanship, which are both pattern classes. In showmanship the person showing leads their horse through a pattern while on the ground. In horsemanship the rider is mounted and must complete a pattern correctly on their horse. At the clinic there was many different levels of riders and all members got a chance to work with Terry on the patterns several times. This clinic will be very helpful during the Ventura County Fair that our horse project members will be attending in July.

The day was long, but everyone had a great time learning patterns and getting to know other members from different clubs.
