different County, but I hope you'll plan to visit.



2018 HEALTHY LIVING RESOLUTIONS

Make 2018 your healthiest year yet! Add these tips from the Center for Disease Control (CDC) to your resolution list to boost your health and well-being!

- Make an appointment for a check-up, vaccination, or screening. Regular oral and medical exams and tests can help find problems before they start. They also can help find problems early, when your chances for treatment and cure are better.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water to prevent the spread of infection and illness. Handwashing involves five simple and effective steps wet, lather, scrub, rinse, and dry. Learn more about when and how to wash your hands.
- 3. Make healthy food choices. A healthy eating plan emphasizes fruits, vegetables, whole grains, and fat-free or low-fat milk and milk products. It also includes lean meats, poultry, fish, beans, eggs, and nuts, and is low in saturated fats, trans fats, cholesterol, salt (sodium), and added sugars.

- 4. Get active! Start small try taking the stairs instead of the elevator, or parking further from your destination. Consider mall walking if the weather is cold or icy. Adults should get at least 2½ hours a week of moderate-intensity physical activity.
- 5. Be smokefree. For most 4-Hers, this means making a resolution not to start any tobacco products, including "vaping". If your resolution is to help someone you care for become smokefree, the CDC has tips and help available.
- 6. Get enough sleep. Insufficient sleep is associated with a number of chronic diseases and conditions—such as type 2 diabetes, cardiovascular disease, obesity, and depression. Adults need seven or more hours per night. 4-H youth may need as many as 10 hours depending upon their age and activity level.
