Do not enter anything into 4hOnline before receiving email instructions from the State or County 4-H Office.
- Deadline for re-enrolling youth members and adult volunteer project leaders/helpers: Friday, July 27.
- Deadline for new youth members: Dec. 1, 2018.
- Deadline for choosing a project: Dec. 31, 2018



4-H Science is, above all, informal science programming in the context of positive youth development. 4-H Science core competencies identify how staff/volunteers can be competent and caring resources to youth, organizations, and communities. 4-H youth development professionals and volunteers implement 4-H Science programs that offer the eight *Essential Elements*:

- **Caring Adult**: Understands that each young person benefits from a positive relationship with a caring adult.
- **Safe Environment**: Creates an emotionally and physically safe learning environment.
- Inclusive Environment (belonging): Designs inclusive learning environments.
- See **Oneself in the Future** (sense of hope): Nurtures an atmosphere of optimism and a positive belief in the future.
- Values and Practices Service to Others: Encourages an ethic of caring and civic responsibility.
- **Opportunities for Self-Determination**: Encourages and supports independence in youth.
- **Opportunities for Mastery:** Provides opportunities for youth to develop skills, competence, and expertise.
- Engagement in Learning: Encourages youth to direct and manage their own

Other projects may prohibited for primary members due to animal size or equipment needed to participate in the project.
