This just in! A brand new (to us) management model

Launched in San Luis Obispo in 1985 and adopted by Santa Barbara in 2011, the "middle management approach" is coming soon to Ventura County 4-H. The purpose of this approach is to get more volunteers involved in *specific* areas of the program (such as fundraising or Healthy Living), utilize the passions and strengths of our volunteers, increase the quality of our program and enable us to have a positive impact on the lives of more people—youth and adults.

In April, the "Ventura County 4-H Futures Task Force" was formed, a team of 9 including staff, county ambassadors and 4-H volunteers. The team meetings are led by Gemma Miner from the state 4-H office via Zoom. At the first meeting, the team listed the strengths and challenges of our county's current programs and management model. Then we listed our "opportunities." One theme that kept coming up was "Building COMMUNITY & CONNECTION."

Gemma explained that there will be two boards: a Management Board and a Program Board. The Management Board will consist of "directors" with specific responsibilities. Ventura County 4-H will now have Directors of Fundraising, Budget & Finance, Outreach & Communication, Fair Liaison, and Recognition. The County Ambassadors will also serve on the Management Board in 1-2 seats reserved for them. These directors will meet four times a year and vote on business as needed. Each director can create a committee to assist them with their area of responsibility. Their four meetings will be "public" in that any 4-H member or volunteer may attend and give their input.

The second board is the Program Board consisting of "Key Leaders" in program areas. The Futures Task Force chose to combine some of our current PDCs (Program Development Committees) and add more. These Key Leaders will lead committees (open to everyone) in the following program areas: Adult Leadership, Youth Leadership, STEAM, Animal Science, Consumer Science, Skills, Civic Engagement and Service, Healthy Living, Equine Science, Shooting Sports: Archery, and Adventure.

Anyone can apply to be a Director or Key Leader, including 4-H seniors (13-19), adult volunteers and even community members or college students who want to help 4-H (on the condition they become official 4-H volunteers, of course).

Currently, the Futures Task Force is working on job descriptions for the Directors and Key Leaders. These should be done by the June 26 Council meeting. Applications and job descriptions will then be available on our website.

Please come to our June 26 council meeting at 7pm at the farm (UC HAREC, 287 S. Briggs Rd., Santa Paula) when the Futures Task Force will introduce this new model. The meeting will be followed by a Summer Kick-Off Social when all your questions will hopefully be answered!

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

Green Hats by 2020

Just as a reminder, we're in the final year of the transition before all youth members will move to wearing green hats only. Here was the language about hats from the uniform transition plan:

"Current Senior members (2015-16 enrolled) with existing white hats may continue to use their white hat for the



remainder of their 4-H career. Only green hats with the new UC ANR brand and 4-H logo will be available for purchase as of August 31, 2015. There is no need to discard pre-purchased green hats that have not yet been distributed to members. These existing hats may be given to members until the existing stockpile has been depleted. We expect that by July 1st 2020, all members will be wearing green hats."
