

"FUR & FEATHERS" Shows and Jr. Showmanship Events – HUGE SUCCESS!

The Ventura County 4-H Small Animal Science Program Development Committee hosted their 1st 4-H Youth Only "Fur & Feathers" All Breed Cavy, Rabbit and Poultry Shows & Jr. Showmanship Events, Saturday, November 17th, 2007 at the Ventura County Fairgrounds.

California 4-H youth members were invited to participate and exhibit in various educational and life-science competitions. Members from seven counties attended including Fresno, Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, San Luis Obispo, Santa Barbara and Ventura.



Youth 4-H members, leaders and family members collectively organized, and facilitated these events from several Ventura County 4-H Clubs, which included Conejo Valley 4-H, Loma Vista 4-H, Las Posas 4-H, Mupu 4-H, Tierra Rejada 4-H, and Santa Rosa Valley 4-H. THANKS ALL!

Medals and ribbons where awarded to Educational Posters exhibited by the 4-H youth educating the viewer about facts and information of the care, breeding, anatomy, country of origin, and other, for each of the three animal species.

Medals and ribbons were also awarded in Jr. Showmanship competitions where 4-H youth exhibitors presented to a judge how to examine their cavy, poultry or rabbit for health and condition, breed characteristics, and to further demonstrate their scope of knowledge of the life-sciences for their individual animal.

Exhibiting in each of the three All Breed Conformation Shows, 4-H members' cavies, poultry or rabbits were examined by licensed judges who compared each specie to its breed's Standard of Perfection to award placements for each exhibit, and ultimately Best in Show. At the conclusion of conformation judging, the judges offered constructive and educational critiques for the animals


