2011 Ventura County Fair



The 2011 Ventura County Fair (August 3-14, 2011) is just around the corner and for those youth exhibitors planning on raising meat pen turkeys for the Junior Livestock Auction, the following changes will be in effect for the 2011 Ventura County Fair:

- 1) Due to processing and carcass quality issues, only white birds will be accepted as entries;
- 2) Turkeys must be 16 to 20 weeks of age as of the first day of Fair, August 3, 2011; and
- 3) Minimum and maximum weights for turkeys have been established:

Toms: 25 lbs minimum – 35 lbs maximum Hens: 15 lbs minimum – 25 lbs maximum

Trick Or Treat So Others Can Eat

We Did It Again!

Trick or Treat So Others Can Eat (TOTSOCE) was a huge success this year, despite the hardships of the bad economy. We had numerous 4-H clubs and other youth organizations such as AYSO, helping the cause and coming up with new and creative ways to collect as much canned food for Ventura County FOOD Share as possible.

Bins were placed at several new locations including Cross Fit Ventura and Foothill Technology High School. Each of these locations proved to be a prime spot for the bins and each collected about 100 pounds of canned goods or other non-perishable food items.

AYSO also joined the TOTSOCE team when they decided to hold a Region 39 food collection contest at their soccer games. Each team was encouraged to collect and donate as much as possible and all together the 2,100 soccer players collected over 4,000 cans of food.

Most food was directly donated to FOOD Share, Ventura County's food bank; however some clubs were able to donate their collected items to other food banks in their communities, including HELP food bank in Ojai and a local food pantry in Fillmore.

Overall, Trick or Treat So Others Can Eat was able to donate over 5,000 pounds of non-perishable food items to food banks throughout Ventura County.

It is great to know that lots of families will be able to enjoy a Thanksgiving and Christmas dinner because of all of the hard work put in by many Ventura County children.

Fruit and Vegetable Consumption on the Rise in Young Children

The Produce for Better Health Foundation released new data last month showing children under the age of 12 have been eating more fruits and vegetables since 2004. Teen consumption of fruit and vegetables has declined, however, with a 6 percent decrease in vegetable consumption and a 2 percent decrease in fruit consumption since 2004. Positive Social Traits Trump Bad Health Habits

A new study suggests that things fall into place with good psychological health. Many studies have documented the dangers of the traditional negative physical risk factors on health—far less research has focused on the role of positive psychological and social supports. The research identified physical exercise, social support and control beliefs as significant predictors of change in functional health, above and beyond the negative effects of the traditional risk factors such as excessive smoking, drinking and being overweight.
