

Trick or Treat So Others Can Eat (TOTSOCE) is a county wide community service project organized by Ventura County 4-H to benefit FOOD Share, Ventura County's food bank. It is simply an annual food drive that benefits over 38,000 monthly clients of FOOD Share from Thousand Oaks to Simi Valley to Ojai, Oxnard, Ventura, and many more! This year many 4-H groups participated as well as the Ventura Jewish Parenting Group, who stood in front of Trader Joe's with their children and collected many pounds of food. We were excited this year to also have participation from outside of our County. Abbie 4-H Club in Pleasanton, California and Anderson High School in Cincinnati, Ohio both did a great job collecting in their communities and selected non-profit food banks from their areas!

This year, TOTSOCE participants collected a grand total of 4,170 pounds of food for FOOD Share! This is a 67% increase from last year when we collected approximately 2,500 pounds of canned goods. This 4,170 pounds does not include the efforts of Abbie 4-H and Anderson High School. We are sure they were successful as well.

We especially want to thank our sponsor, Community West Bank, for taking the time to help us organize and let us place food collection bins in their Ventura and Westlake Village branches. Also a big thank you to Bo Jaxon of B95.1 radio (a Cumulus station), who helped us promote TOTSOCE on his morning show. Above all we would like to thank all of our participants for making this County a better place by helping to feed thousands of hungry people each year. You all really do make a difference and we appreciate it so much! Please participate next year in our annual TOTSOCE program. Our goal will be over 5,000 pounds!

Meeting & Event Facilities

If you are planning to have meetings at a facility that requires completion of a facility use agreement or if the facility asks for a Certificate of Insurance, please call the 4-H Office before you complete any paperwork required by the facility.

4-H Leaders may NOT sign facility agreements. These agreements must be signed by the County Director.

- 1. **Contact the facility** to confirm the dates are available and ask that the needed dates be "penciled in" on the facility's calendar (if possible).
- Ask for an application for use of the facility read it, **BUT DO NOT FILL** IT OUT until you contact the 4-H Office.
- 3. Find out if any application fees or usage fees are required for use of the facility.
- 4. **Call 645-1470**. Let us know what kind of meeting or event will be held at the facility (Cavy project, Club general meeting, Food Faire event, etc.), the name and phone number of the facility, the date(s) and time(s) of the meeting(s), and any special requirements.

Keep in mind that facility paperwork takes TIME to process. Depending on the facility, it may take several weeks or more to complete the paperwork necessary to make the facility available to you.

- 5. 4-H Office When the 4-H Office gets the information from you, we will process the necessary paperwork and provide you with a copy of the approved agreement when received.
- 6. For Parades, City organized community events, Fundraising Booths, etc. - Please call the 4-H Office for more information before signing or submitting any paperwork to the organization putting on the event.

Georgetta Brickey, 4-H Technical Specialist, will be retiring from the Ventura County 4-H Office on January 8th, 2009.


Georgetta was your 4-H voice-on-the-phone at 805-645-1470 since September 1994.


Guinea Pigs (Cavies) on Parade! By Amanda Marshall
