READ IMMEDIATELY! IMPORTANT RE-ENROLLMENT DIRECTIONS!

Our new online enrollment system is almost ready for you to log in and re-enroll! Your Club Leaders will be letting you know when the system is ready for you to sign in and enroll for 2009 / 2010 & what they need from you in addition to the online process. Sometime between now and July (date unknown; tentatively the 6th), *currently enrolled members & volunteers* will receive an e-mail from 4hOnline stating that your password has been re-set. Hold onto that e-mail in a safe place, you won't be able to use it until July when your Club Leader e-mails you that the system is ready. Download & complete the paper forms as directed while completing the online enrollment process that. The forms for the Youth will consist of; the Medical Release (BOTH sides) and Waiver of Liability. The Adults will need to complete the same as Youth plus a Confidential Volunteer Self-Disclosure form.

When you've received notice from your Club Leader:

- 1. go to https://california.4honline.com & choose "I have a profile", type your e-mail address, type your password. Role defaults to Family & is the option that you want. Click "Login".
- 2. Locate your name on the screen & click "Edit" found at the far right of your name.
- 3. On EACH page, Verify all your information is correct Make all corrections and changes to the projects for the 2009 / 2010 year, at the bottom of the page click "Continue". When you've completed ALL the pages & clicked "Continue" after completing the tabs of page 3, you'll be taken back to the screen you found at Step 1 above.
- 4. Complete the paper forms & turn them in to your Club Leader / Enrollment person.

For those that do not have internet access (Re-enrolling & New); the Entire Paper Enrollment Packet is required to be completed – these packets can be obtained from your Club Leader or the 4-H Office.

For New Youth & Volunteers with internet access:

- 1. go to https://california.4honline.com & choose "I need to setup a profile", if you are a military family check that box, & complete the following fields: County (choose Ventura), Email (required for access), Confirm Email, Last Name, Password, Confirm Password. Role defaults to Family & is the option you that want. Click "Create Login", you'll be taken into the system to enter your information.
- 2. Complete all the fields on each page, at the bottom of the page click on "Continue". Do the same for all 3 pages. Page 3 has 3 tabs, you must complete tabs one & two, completing tab three is helpful if it pertains to you. On page 3, you must click continue to save your selections this will also take you to the next tab. When you've **completed all of the pages**; click "Submit Enrollment"
- 3. Complete the paper forms & turn them in to your Club Leader / Enrollment person.

Welcome to the new Ventura County All-Star Program!

All-Star is the highest attainable county 4-H rank. Each year, Ventura County, as well as other California counties, selects several deserving 4-H members who have applied to become All-Stars.

The minimum requirements of an All-Star candidate are:

- Currently enrolled 4-H member, in good standing with his/her club.
- 14 years of age by January 1 of the year they are selected. (Note: 15 years of age for the 2009-10 year since we are selecting after the new 4-H year starts)
- Has strong interest in working with the All-Star team, leaders, and members at club and county levels on programs, activities, and events.
- Has specific ideas about ways to give guidance and leadership to some phase of the 4-H program.
- Has demonstrated leadership abilities, citizenship concern, and maturity of judgment.
- Recognizes the opportunities and responsibilities of being selected a 4-H All-Star and is receptive to new ideas and challenges.
- Has made a significant contribution to the maintenance or expansion of the 4-H program in the county.
- Recognizes that there is a significant time commitment that comes along with being an All-Star, which includes attending county events, meetings, and representing 4-H in other ways throughout the two year program.

After being selected, All-Star candidates are expected to:

Year One

- Plan and complete an All-Star project.
- Develop public speaking, program planning and officer skills.
- Assist second year All-Stars with events and projects.

Year Two


- Represent Ventura County as an All-Star at various county and area events and programs.
- Plan and complete an All-Star community service activity.

Just being selected as an All-Star is an award in itself, as it shows great achievement by the member. Each All-Star is awarded an All-Star pin and emblem for their 4-H hat. SERIES - It Came From Planted Earth (2006)

Topic Area: Plant Science | Audience: Youth grades 4 - 6

"It Came From Planted Earth" provides activities using the scientific process and discussions to gain a better understanding of agriculture. It has been extensively pilot-tested as a useful tool in helping elementary students to begin to gain knowledge about agriculture and its application in the real world.

Each session provides hands on activities for youth to explore agriculture from the beginning seeds to the foods we eat to the importance of water and soil to production. Further exploration is given about current issues in agriculture from biotechnology to integrated pest management to urban-rural interface.

The session outline provides an overall purpose and background material. Then, each activity states an objective, materials that will be needed, getting ready, suggested grouping, action steps and sciencing questions. Youth are encouraged to further explore their world with hands-on experiments and community action.
