## **Change to Club Year and Enrollment Dates!**

To align our 4-H Program with the Statewide 4-H Financial and Program Year, the Ventura County 4-H Program will be changing our club year and our enrollment period. Your Club leaders recently met with 4-H Staff to learn about this change. Effective immediately:

- ✤ The 2007-08 club year will end 6/30/08.
- **Re-enrollments will be due to the 4-H Office by 6/30/08 for the 2008-09 club year, which starts 7/1/08.**
- MEMBERS AND LEADERS RE-ENROLLING BY 6/30/08 WILL NOT BE CHARGED <u>ANY</u> COUNTY 4-H PROGRAM ENROLLMENT FEES FOR THE 2008-09 YEAR! Note: Some clubs have a club enrollment fee which is used for refreshments, club supplies, etc. These fees may still apply.
- Re-enrollments received 7/1/08 7/31/08 will be charged regular enrollments fees. Those received 8/1/08 8/31/08 will be charged regular enrollment fee plus \$10 late fee. Re-enrollments received 9/1/08 9/30/08 will be charged regular enrollment fee plus \$20 late fee.
- Project Leaders applying for reappointment must attach their completed Project Plan to their leader application, and submit <u>both application and project plan together</u>.
- **\*** Deadline for enrollment in market animal and horse projects will be November 1.
- Club Operations
  - Club officers (President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer) must be elected in April or May.
  - Club Budget for the 2008-09 year will be due to the 4-H Office no later than June 25<sup>th</sup> for the upcoming year
    - Funds cannot be disbursed until the budget has been approved by the membership and the 4-H Office.
- Numerous training sessions for new volunteers will be conducted starting in May 2008.
- Record Books Fern Vacca, our county record book specialist, will help members and leaders with record book questions that may come up due to the club year change. We will also schedule several record book workshops to help members with their books, including an all-day open house to be held after the end of the school year.

Postmark Deadline: April 10, 2008

The Ventura County Chapter of the California Women for Agriculture (CWA) strives to promote Agriculture awareness & education within our Communities. They are seeking Female and Male Candidates to apply for their scholarships to be awarded in June 2008.

They will be awarding at least one scholarship of \$1,000 and two scholarships of \$500. The requirements are as follows;

- Student and/or Parent/Guardian have been employed in Ventura County Agriculture for the past two years. (Farm labor, works for an industry involved in Agriculture i.e.; chemical company, owner of a farm or agriculture related industry) OR
- 2) Student is a one year member, in good standing, with FFA, 4-H or Grange.
- 3) Student is pursuing a Bachelor's degree (4-year), an Associate's degree (2-year) or a degree from an accredited trade school in agriculture or related subject area.

Further requirements for Finalists may be to meet with the CWA Scholarship Committee for an interview. The following <u>MUST BE POSTMARKED NO LATER THAN APRIL 10, 2008.</u> <u>Late Applications and/or Letters of Recommendations will not be considered</u>;

- 1) Completed 2-page Application
  - 2) Recommendation Form(s): at least 1 but no more than 3 will be accepted per applicant.

Showmanship was taught to new and inexperienced members by Ventura County youth in Rabbit, Poultry, and Cavy Projects. Each species provided some activities or services to the field day as well. The rabbit section included a tattooing station and the cavy area had a tagging station. New this year was a Live Breed Identification Contest. 4-H'ers had to identify the breed and color variety of 12 rabbits, 5 cavies, and 10 poultry.

Also new for this year's field day was a Costume Contest. All ages could enter their rabbit, dog, cavy, chicken, or any other type of pocket pet in the event. There were some really cute costumes out there!
