Only 2 Months Left!!!

Yes, it is hard to believe, but there are only two months left in the current 4-H Club year! There is a lot going on at this time of the year as school, sports, 4-H, and other commitments and activities are coming to year's end. It is also a time when new opportunities are opening up!

One of those is how you can help your club in the New Year which starts July 1st. Will you have time to run for a club office or serve on the board in some way? If your club hasn't already had elections of officers for the coming year, it is time to do so! Consider what job you would like to have on the board, but remember that with each position, there are many responsibilities! Check the Club Officer's Manual for details. Your club leader has a copy of this booklet, and it is also available on the state 4-H website at: http://www.ca4h.org/4hresource/forms/manuals/4H1036-OfficersManual.pdf

Once elections are held, an installation of officers should be conducted. If your club needs some help in conducting an installation ceremony, there are six examples at the Nebraska 4-H website: http://4h.unl.edu/volunteers/InfoSeries.htm

After the new officers have been installed, it is time to begin planning the new 4-H year! Yes, the new club officers plan the year, with the guidance of the club leaders. The Officer's Manual has some forms to help plan the year. (See link to this manual above.) Another form that is helpful in planning a fun and educational year for all your members is the 4-H Unit Program Planning Guide: http://www.ca4h.org/policy/chapter5/UC4HYDP5-Unit_Pgrm_Plan_GuideMay.doc. Each club is required to complete this form and submit it to the 4-H Office annually. During, and then at the end of the year, officers review their plans to see what they have accomplished. The completed form is then returned to the 4-H Office and achievement seals are awarded.

In the next few weeks, we will be setting a date for the Club Officer Training Session and the Treasurer Training Session. The Club Officer Training Session is <u>MANDATORY</u> for the President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer. All other officers are not required to attend but are welcome. Club officer and leadership skills will be covered. Be sure to attend! <u>ALL CLUB TREASURERS ARE REQUIRED TO ATTEND THE SESSION THAT WILL BE SCHEDULED FOR MEMBERS WHO WILL BE SERVING AS CLUB TREASURER!</u> Although the treasurer's duties and responsibilities will be gone over in the Club Officer Training Session, the Treasurer Training is separate and much more in detail, and again, required by the state 4-H program.

Speaking of the treasure's position, as the end of the year approaches, the current treasurer should be working with the club leader or the adult advisor to the treasurer to make sure that all the financial reports for the year are in order.

It is also time for the club secretary to make sure that all minutes of club meetings are complete and have been approved by the membership, and that all attendance records are in order.

Yes, it is a busy time of year! But, being a club officer and completing the duties that come with the job are important, and club officers learn valuable leadership skills that will be of benefit throughout the years to come!

Horse Project members represent Ventura County at Southern Regional Horse Show




Ventura County 4-H Horse Project members attended the Southern Regional Horse Show and Educational Contest held in Pomona, California in February.
