

Mayday, Mayday!!

Mayday is a code for "I am in trouble and need help" all over the world!

This year several 4-H Leaders have sent a "Mayday" to the 4-H Office asking for help in understanding the recent changes in our County 4-H Program. Here is some information that hopefully will help make things more clear!

No enrollment fees will be collected by the 4-H Office for RETURNING members whose enrollment paperw ork is turned into the 4-H Office by your Club Leaders <u>BEFORE 7-1-08</u>. If you are in 4-H right now, this means you will enroll as a returning member for 2008-09 when the year begins on July 1, 2008. (Your club may ask you for club fees to coveryour meeting expenses and facilities.)

Don't w ait until the last day, dig out your enrollment form, fill it out, have your parents sign it and get it turned into your Club Leader or enrollment person right now ! If you know you are doing a project next year, w rite it on the form. You w ill have addition al opportunities to add projects at upcoming meetings, so don't w ait!

Don't forget to <u>READ all the pages of your form</u>. There are a couple of pages in each form where <u>BOTH sides</u> need to be completed or signed.

After June 30th, enrollment fees DO apply... and they are increasing slightly due to the increase in the State fees.

- 7-1-08 through 7-31-08 Returning enrollments received will be billed at the standard \$28.00 enrollment fee per youth enrollment and \$6.00 per adult enrollment.
- 8-1-08 through 8-31-08 Returning enrollments received will be billed at the standard \$28.00 enrollment fee per youth enrollment and \$6.00 per adult enrollment and also assessed a late fee of \$10.00 per enrollment.
- 9-1-08 through 9-30-08 Returning enrollments received will be billed at the standard \$28.00 enrollment fee per youth enrollment and \$6.00 per adult enrollment and also assessed a late fee of \$20.00 per enrollment.
- > 9-30-08 Deadline for ALL Leaders Enrolling in ANY Project (new and returning)
- > An additional \$10 per month will be assessed on any returning enrollment received after 9-30-08.
- > Late fees are NOT eligible for scholarship funding.
- Members w ho re-enroll after June 30th will not be a low ed to include any 4-H participation betw een July 1 and the re-enrollment date on their records. Also, member participation during that time will not be considered in determining percentage of meetings/events attended.
- > 11-3-08 Deadline for all Members Enrolling in ANY Market Animal or Horse Project
- Re-enrollments for 2008-09 must be received by the 4-H Office for participation in the 2008 Horse Fair, Ventura County Fair, and other 4-H activity.



Small Market Livestock Quality Assurance

This year the Ventura County Fair Small Livestock Department is implementing a new policy regarding the market readiness of rabbit, turkey, and chicken meat pens. Members who plan to bring a small livestock meat pen are now **required** to attend a separate Quality Assurance Training session that has been specifically developed to address these new issues. The first training was held March 29. There will be two more trainings provided: May 24 and June 28. All training begins at 10:00am and will be held in Barn 300 (the small livestock barn).

One of the main issues is product usage on meat pen animals. **No product**, i.e., showsheens, vet rx, oils, insecticides, etc. is to be used on any small livestock that is destined for the dinner table.

Why not?

Picture this, if you will. The cook of your family takes a fresh chicken out of the refrigerator. Before your chef puts this beautiful meal into the oven, he/she sprinkles it with a dab of Vet Rx, then rolls it into a coating of Sevin 7 insecticide dust. To finish off the seasoning, the chef then gives the chicken a healthy spray of Showsheen and maybe some Pink for good measure, then pops the seasoned bird into the oven and in an hour puts it on the table for the family to enjoy.


Do you want to eat a bird prepared this way? Well, this is exactly what you are creating when you add product to your meat animal. **Remember, any product you put on your small livestock animal is absorbed into their skin!** There is not enough time for these products to get off your bird and out of their system before the bird is processed. Whatever is **absorbed into your animal's skin is going to show up on the dinner table.** (Large livestock does not have this issue because most of large livestock is skinned before it is cut up. You, as a small livestock producer, don't have this option.)

Someone is going to consume the product you produced, therefore it needs to be as pure, clean and wholesome as possible. It is **imperative** that you **do not use ANY product** on your meat pen animals, other than **weterin ary approved medications/topicals** (in case of sickness/injury). All medications/topicals **must be de clared** on your Quality Assurance paperwork and all animals entered into the fair must be free from any medication/topical residue when cooped, so be sure to check the withdrawal dates.
