They may direct members to make reasonable decisions that follow 4-H policies, procedures, and guidelines. They also ensure that decisions and activities are in line with local and state laws. Our club leaders are mentors, who work with our youth officers (boards) to learn leadership an citizenship skills, as well as important life skills.

The 4-H staff is here to help leaders and members. We are a small, but dedicated staff. We thank all the members, parents, project leaders, and club leaders for helping us make the program a valuable experience for our youth! Remember, 4-H is a youth organization. Let's all continue to work together, giving members this exceptional opportunity to learn while having fun in the 4-H Program!

#### WHAT IS TRICK OR TREAT SO OTHERS CAN EAT?

Trick or Treat So Others Can Eat (TOTSOCE) is a project organized by Ventura County 4-H All-Stars to collect cans of food and other non-perishable food items to benefit the over 38,000 monthly clients of Ventura County's Food Share program. Food Share is Ventura County's only regional food bank that distributes collected food through a network of 240 certified charitable agencies serving children, families in crisis, low-income seniors, homeless, handicapped, disabled and many others living within the cities and communities of Ventura County; from Thousand Oaks to Simi Valley to Ojai, Oxnard, Ventura and more.

## HERE'S HOW YOUR CLUB CAN HELP!

Each club is encouraged to participate and is asked to assign a junior leader to run the project. All TOTSOCE junior leaders are to register their club ASAP by sending an email to



totsoce@gmail.com. Please provide:

- Club name
- •Junior Leader name, telephone number, and email address
- Approx. number of club participants
- •Establish a goal for pounds of food collected

Volunteers use a "Starter Kit" (available on the TOTSOCE website coming soon!) which includes door hangers and thank you notes printed on bright orange paper. Volunteers are asked to hang the door hangers stating what day they will be back to actually collect the cans, typically 2-3 days later. Upon collecting the cans the volunteers then leave a thank you note behind so



the donator knows they've been there. All collected food should be taken directly to Food Share. (If there is more than 200 pounds of food in one place a food share truck can be called to pick up the

food).

This year we are excited to announce that Gold Coast Transit (formerly known as SCAT) will be participating in TOTSOCE. The details are still being worked out; however we will likely see higher visibility in the media for TOTSOCE due to this partnership. Stay tuned for details! Also, Community West Bank branches in Ventura and Westlake Village will also have collection bins again this year.

TOTSOCE is a great community service project for other youth groups/organizations as well. Examples include but are not limited to: churches, boy/girl scouts, schools, individuals, and/or clubs of any kind. So help us get the word out!



Before their departure, delegates widen their experience with community action by implementing a "Plan of Action" in their community. Before they travel, plans are submitted to the State 4-H Office and a special pin is awarded to all active members of the county team. Washington Focus can be the beginning of a life of public participation that leaves each delegate with a strong determination to become involved.

#### California Focus Program

California Focus is a unique 4-H Citizenship educational experience that combines hands-on participation in workshops, debates, and simulations with outstanding speakers and visits to historical, cultural, and governmental sites in California. California's capital city, Sacramento, becomes a "living classroom" for this five-day, action packed adventure that allows delegates to experience state government. As a citizen of "Sierra Cascade" delegates register to vote, conduct a political campaign, elect constitutional offices, analyze the needs and issues of your district, and enact legislation with the goal of securing the governor's signature to make your bill a law.

Legislative appointments at the Capitol will allow delegates to meet face-to-face with their senators and assembly person to discuss current issues, learn how proposals are funded, and advocate for issues critical to them and their fellow constituents.

Delegates extend their learning as they prepare and present a "Plan of Action" to implement back home in their respective communities. Outstanding plans are showcased at the conference and once the Plan of Action final report is filed with the California 4-H Youth Development state office in the spring, a specially designed citizenship pin is awarded to each member of the county team. California Focus can be the beginning of a life of public participation that leaves you with a strong determination to become involved with the political process.
